

AN ACT RELATIVE TO EMPLOYEES OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY IN THE MILITARY SERVICE. *Chap.720*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Any employee of the Metropolitan Transit Authority shall be entitled, during the time of his service in the organized militia, under sections eleven, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, one hundred and five or one hundred and fifty-four of chapter thirty-three of the General Laws, or during his annual tour of duty of not exceeding fifteen days as a member of the organized reserve of the army of the United States or of the United States naval reserve forces, to receive pay therefor, without loss of his ordinary remuneration as an employee of the Metropolitan Transit Authority, and shall also be entitled to the same leaves of absence or vacation with pay given to other like employees.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF NORTH ADAMS TO APPROPRIATE AND PAY A SUM OF MONEY TO ISAAC BERGER. *Chap.721*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. For the purpose of promoting the public good the city of North Adams may appropriate and pay to Isaac Berger the sum of three hundred dollars for services rendered from October first, nineteen hundred and forty-eight to April first, nineteen hundred and forty-nine in providing skating facilities and housing for skaters at Windsor lake in said city.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF CONWAY TO BORROW MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING A TOWN HALL BUILDING. *Chap.722*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. For the purpose of constructing and originally equipping and furnishing a town hall building to replace the town hall building destroyed by fire, the town of Conway may borrow from time to time within a period of five years from the passage of this act such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding in the aggregate one hundred thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor which shall bear on their face the words, Conway Town Hall Building Loan, Act of 1950. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan and such loan shall be paid in not more than twenty years from the date of issue. Indebtedness incurred under this act shall be in excess of the statutory limit but shall, except as provided herein, be
