

Chap.487 AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE DATE UPON WHICH BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES, EXCEPT THE STATE HOUSE, OWNED OR OCCUPIED BY THE COMMONWEALTH OR ANY OF ITS POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS SHALL COMPLY WITH CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE LAW RELATING TO THE SAFETY OF PERSONS IN BUILDINGS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to defer immediately the date upon which buildings and structures, except the state house, owned or occupied by the commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions shall comply with certain provisions of the law relating to the safety of persons in buildings, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 582 of the acts of 1948 is hereby amended by striking out section 3, as amended by chapter 153 of the acts of 1954, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —
Section 3. This act shall take effect on July first, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine. *Approved June 29, 1957.*

Chap.488 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE WHITMAN-HANSON REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT TO REMOVE AND RE-INTER CERTAIN REMAINS LOCATED IN GRAVES IN THE TOWN OF HANSON AND THE TOWN OF WHITMAN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The Whitman-Hanson Regional School District is hereby authorized to remove all remains in any grave or graves in the property of Charles A. Oertel in the town of Hanson, said graves being located at a point one hundred feet, more or less, south of the Whitman-Hanson town line on the easterly side of Franklin street in said town and thence about six hundred feet, more or less, in an easterly direction. After such removal the said district shall re-inter the remains of Amos Whitmarsh, son of Jacob and Hannah Whitmarsh, in the Mount Zion Cemetery in the town of Whitman in his family lot, and shall re-inter any other remains so removed in any other cemetery located in the town of Whitman or in the town of Hanson marking the new graves in so far as now marked, or may permit any descendant or relative to remove the remains of such person, and re-inter such remains in accordance with applicable laws and regulations concerning burial.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
