

Chap. 197. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CERTIFICATION OF NAMES TO FILL CIVIL SERVICE POSITIONS WHEN THE DIRECTOR OF CIVIL SERVICE HAS WAIVED RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 8B, as amended by chapter 6 of the acts of 1970, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —

Section 8B. The director may waive domiciliary requirements in any examination for any person who has successfully completed at least one academic year at a recognized college or university in the commonwealth, provided such person meets all other entrance requirements.

SECTION 2. Said chapter 31 is hereby further amended by striking out section 19, as appearing in the Tercenary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —

Section 19. Except as otherwise provided by law, in all positions, employments and work in any branch of the service of the commonwealth, or of any county, city, town or district therein, persons who are domiciled in the commonwealth shall be given preference; provided, when the director waives domiciliary requirements in accordance with the civil service rules or the provisions of section eight B, any person who does not have a domicile in the commonwealth and who otherwise qualifies shall be placed on the eligible list in accordance with the civil service law and rules.

Chap. 198. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF MELROSE TO GRANT A RETROACTIVE PAY RAISE TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 7 of the acts of 1971 is hereby amended by striking out the words “, excluding the chief of police,”.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 199. AN ACT VALIDATING THE ACTION OF THE TOWN OF DARTMOUTH IN GRANTING RETROACTIVE SALARY INCREASES TO CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS OF SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the town of Dartmouth may appropriate money for the payment of, and pay, salary increases to employees of the department of public works of said town, excluding office clerical, supervisory and engineering employees, for the period from January the first, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine to March the thirty-first, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine, inclusive.

SECTION 2. Any action taken by the town of Dartmouth pursuant to the authorization contained in section one of this act is hereby validated and confirmed to the same extent as though this act had been in full force and effect at the time of the posting of the warrant for the meeting at which such action was taken.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
