held by said town. Any amount in said fund which is not paid out by the commissioners in accordance with the provisions of this act and which remains in said fund at the end of a fiscal year shall be added to said fund to be paid out by the commissioners in subsequent years in accordance with the provisions of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chapter 97. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CAPE COD CHAPTER NO. 96 DISABLED AMERICAN VETERANS, INC. TO SELL AND CONVEY A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND IN THE TOWN OF BARNSTABLE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter five hundred and fifty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty-three or any other general or special law to the contrary, the Cape Cod Chapter No. 96 Disabled American Veterans, Inc. is hereby authorized to sell and convey a certain parcel of land situated in the town of Barnstable and described in said chapter five hundred and fifty-four. The proceeds of said sale shall be retained in escrow and may only be expended for the purpose of purchasing a new site for the headquarters of said Cape Cod Chapter No. 96 Disabled American Veterans, Inc. If said proceeds have not been expended within five years of the date of their receipt, all monies in said escrow account shall revert to the commonwealth.

Chapter 98. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR RECALL ELECTIONS IN THE TOWN OF GROTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who holds an elected office in the town of Groton and who has held such office for four months and has more than six months remaining in the term of such office on the date of filing of the affidavit referred to in section two, may be recalled from office by the registered voters of said town in the manner provided herein.

SECTION 2. Twenty-five or more registered voters from each precinct of the town of Groton for a total of at least fifty voters may file with the town clerk of said town an affidavit containing the name of the officer whose recall is sought and a statement of one or more of the following grounds upon which the petition is based: lack of fitness, corruption, incompetence, neglect of duties, malfeasance, misfeasance or violation of oath. The town clerk shall deliver to said voters petition blanks demanding such recall, printed forms of which said clerk shall keep available. Such blanks shall be completed by writing or type-
