AN ACT PROVIDING A PENSION FOR JOHN M. GANLEY OF FALMOUTH, A FORMER MEMBER OF THE STATE POLICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subject to appropriation, there shall be paid out
2 of the state treasury to John M. Ganley of Falmouth
3 who was injured while in the performance of his
4 duties as a member of the state police in August,
5 nineteen hundred and thirty-five, an annual pension
6 equal to one half the salary he was receiving at the
7 time of said injury. Said pension shall be payable
8 monthly, commencing upon the date of the approval
9 of payment by the governor and council.
