AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN PERSONS ELIGIBLE FOR OLD AGE ASSISTANCE, SO CALLED, NOTWITHSTANDING THE EARNING OF WAGES BY THEIR CHILDREN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section two of chapter one hundred
2 and eighteen A of the General Laws, as most recently
3 amended by section two of chapter seven hundred
4 and twenty-nine of the acts of nineteen hundred and
5 forty-one, is hereby further amended by inserting
6 after the fourth sentence the following new sen-
7 tence:— No applicant for assistance hereunder shall
8 be refused such assistance or be paid less than the
9 minimum amount established by section one by reason
10 of the earning of wages by a child of such applicant.

1 SECTION 2. Section two A of said chapter one
2 hundred and eighteen A, inserted by section three
3 of said chapter seven hundred and twenty-nine, is
4 hereby repealed.
