AN ACT CHANGING THE NAME OF ENDICOTT, INCORPORATED, TO ENDICOTT JUNIOR COLLEGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The name of Endicott, Incorporated, a corporation
2 incorporated under general law, is hereby changed to
3 Endicott Junior College; and said corporation may
4 use the designation of "college" as aforesaid not-
5 withstanding the provisions of section six A of chap-
6 ter three of the General Laws, inserted by section two
7 of chapter four hundred and twenty-four of the acts
8 of nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, and of section
9 eighty-nine of chapter two hundred and sixty-six of
10 the General Laws.
