AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROVIDING HIGHER EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHILDREN OF MASSACHUSETTS MEN AND WOMEN WHO DIED IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, OR AS A RESULT OF SUCH SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 7B of chapter 69 of
2 the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter
3 548 of the acts of 1946, is hereby amended by insert-
4 ing after the word "war" in line 6 the words:—
5 , or between September sixteenth, nineteen hundred
6 and forty and December eighth, nineteen hundred and
7 forty-one, — so as to read as follows: — The common-
8 wealth, acting through the department, may con-
9 tribute toward the expenses of the higher education
10 of any child, resident in the commonwealth and not
11 under sixteen years of age, whose father or mother
12 entered the armed forces of the United States in time
13 of war, or between September sixteenth, nineteen
14 hundred and forty and December eighth, nineteen
15 hundred and forty-one, and was killed in action or
16 died from other cause as a result of such service.
