AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENT BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of chapter 24 of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by section 37 of chapter 591
3 of the acts of 1946, is hereby further amended by
4 striking out, in line 3, the words "seven thousand"
5 and inserting in place thereof the words: — seventy-
6 five hundred, — and by striking out, in line 6, the
7 words "seventy-five hundred" and inserting in place
8 thereof the words: — eighty-five hundred, — so as
9 to read as follows: — *Section 2.* The industrial acci-
10 dent board shall consist of nine members, one of whom
11 shall be a woman, at such salaries, not exceeding
12 seventy-five hundred dollars each, as the governor and
13 council determine, except that the chairman, who
14 shall be designated by the governor, shall receive such
15 salary, not exceeding eighty-five hundred dollars, as
16 the governor and council determine. Upon the ex-
17 piration of the term of office of a member, his successor
18 shall be appointed for five years by the governor, with
19 the advice and consent of the council. The members
20 shall devote their whole time in business hours to work
21 of the board.
