AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT APPORTIONMENT COMMISSIONERS FOR SUFFOLK COUNTY SHALL BE ELECTED FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section one hundred and sixty-one of
2 chapter fifty-four of the General Laws is hereby amended
3 by extending the term of office from two to four years
4 so that the commissioners to apportion Suffolk county
5 into representative districts shall hold office for four
6 years from the first Wednesday of January of nineteen
7 hundred and fifty-five.

1 SECTION 2. Said section is further amended by
2 striking out the word "two" in line 7 of the second
3 paragraph and substituting therefor the word: — four.
