AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF GARDNER TO BORROW MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF REMODELING AND MAKING EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS TO THE CONNORS STREET BUILDING.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of remodeling and mak-  
2 ing extraordinary repairs to the Connors street building  
3 for public library purposes and other public offices, the  
4 city of Gardner may borrow a sum, not exceeding thirty-  
5 one thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes  
6 therefor, which shall bear on their face the words, "Con-  
7 nors Street Building Alteration Loan, Act of 1955."  
8 And said loan shall be paid in not more than ten years  
9 from its date, but no issue shall be paid under this act  
10 unless a sum equal to twenty-five cents on each one  
11 thousand dollars of the assessed valuation of the city of  
12 the preceding year has been appropriated from available  
13 revenue funds or raised in the tax levy for the same pur-  
14 pose, in the year in which the loan is ordered. Indebted-  
15 ness incurred under this act shall be in excess of the  
16 statutory limit, but shall, except as provided herein, be  
17 subject to chapter forty-four of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

11. The Constitutionality of the Constitution, as amended, in relation to the right of the people to elect members of the Board of Forestry.

12. The Constitutionality of the Constitution, as amended, in relation to the right of the people to elect members of the Board of Mines.

13. The Constitutionality of the Constitution, as amended, in relation to the right of the people to elect members of the Board of Railroads.
