### MEMORANDUM FROM COMMISSIONER OF CORPORATIONS AND TAXATION.

*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives.*

The above-named petition was transmitted to me by the Clerk of the Senate on December 6, 1954, with the request for a memorandum.

Carpet Club Associates, Inc., was organized on January 31, 1934, under General Laws, chapter 180. It was dissolved on September 26, 1945, by the Supreme Judicial Court and was revived under chapter 300 of the Acts of 1954.

Pursuant to a notice sent by me to the petitioner, a fee of twenty-five dollars has been paid.

As indicated above, the corporation named in the petition was revived by a Special Act of the Legislature (chapter 300, Acts of 1954).

That which the petition seeks to accomplish cannot be effected under the General Laws.

No opinion is expressed on the merits of the bill.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Five.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CARPET CLUB ASSOCIATES, INC.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 300 of the acts of 1954 is hereby amended  
2 by striking out, in lines 5 to 13, inclusive, the words  
3 “; provided, however, that if said corporation seeks to  
4 obtain a license for the sale of alcoholic beverages under  
5 the provisions of section twelve of chapter one hundred  
6 and thirty-eight of the General Laws, the provisions of  
7 section seventeen of said chapter which allow the grant-  
8 ing of additional licenses to such clubs as were licensed  
9 to sell during the year nineteen hundred and thirty-five  
10 all alcoholic beverages shall not apply to said corpora-  
11 tion”.
