The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Seven.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO STATE AID FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 645 of the acts of 1948 is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out clause (a) of section 9, as most recently amended by
3 chapter 329 of the acts of 1954, and inserting in place thereof
4 the following clause: —

5 (a) The total construction grant for any approved school
6 project in any city or town shall be one third of the product
7 of the final approved cost of the project multiplied by the
8 equalized valuation per pupil in net average membership for
9 the entire commonwealth divided by the equalized valuation
10 per pupil in net average membership of the city or town;
11 provided, however, that no grant shall be approved for an
12 amount less than thirty-five per cent nor more than fifty
13 per cent of the final approved cost of the project.

A Bill to Amend the Constitution of the State of Ohio

(The Constitution of the State of Ohio)

That the Constitution of the State of Ohio be amended by adding to Article IV, Section 1, the following words, to-wit:

"The Governor shall hold office for four years, and shall be eligible for re-election once only."

That the Constitution of the State of Ohio be amended by adding to Article IV, Section 2, the following words, to-wit:

"The Governor shall be elected and hold office for four years, and shall be eligible for re-election once only."

"The Governor shall have the honor and rank of Major-General."

"The Governor shall have the right to pardon and commute sentences of all persons convicted of crimes against the State, except in cases of impeachment."
