To accompany the petition of James M. Curley, mayor, that the salaries of the principal assessors of the city of Boston be established. Cities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act establishing the Salaries of the Principal Assessors of the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section two of chapter ninety-three
2 of the Special Acts of nineteen hundred and eighteen
3 as amended by section one of chapter two hundred
4 and eighty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred and
5 twenty-one and as last amended by chapter one
6 hundred of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-
7 eight is hereby further amended by striking out in
8 the fourteenth line the words "five thousand" and
9 inserting in place thereof the words, —sixty-five
10 hundred—so as to read as follows:—*Section 2.*
11 The mayor of the city shall appoint, and may at any
12 time remove, in accordance with the provisions of
13 chapter four hundred and eighty-six of the acts of
14 nineteen hundred and nine, three assessors to hold
15 office for terms of one, two, and three years, re-

16 spectively, beginning with the first day of April in
17 the current year. As the term of each assessor ex-
18 pires, the mayor in like manner shall appoint his
19 successor for a term of three years from the first
20 day of April in the year of appointment. The
21 mayor shall also fill any vacancy for the unexpired
22 term. The mayor shall designate the chairman of
23 the board who shall receive an annual salary of
24 seventy-five hundred dollars; the two other mem-
25 bers of the board shall each receive an annual salary
26 of sixty-five hundred dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance during the current year by vote of the
3 city council of the city of Boston subject to the
4 provisions of its charter but not otherwise.
