AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PENALTY FOR DRUNKEN DRIVING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Permit police to force all suspects of drunken driving to
- 2 submit to take a blood test. The police shall be required to
- 3 take a course at a licensed hospital in the method, use and
- 4 administration of the blood test. The police shall be required
- 5 to show proof of the training before administering the test to
- 6 the suspect of drunken driving and inform the suspect of his
- 7 rights as laid down by the United States Supreme Court
- 8 guidelines.
