The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

Resolve establishing a Special Commission to continue a Study and Investigation relative to a Certain Additional Fitting Memorial to the Men and Women of Massachusetts who served in All Wars in which Massachusetts has participated.

1 *Resolved*, That a special unpaid commission, con-
2 sisting of one member of the senate to be designated
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof, and three persons to be appointed by the
6 governor, with the advice and consent of the council,
7 shall continue the study and investigation relative to
8 a certain additional fitting memorial to the men and
9 women of Massachusetts who served in all wars in
10 which Massachusetts has participated, heretofore con-
11 ducted under sections three, four and five of chapter
12 four hundred and eleven of the acts of nineteen hun-
13 dred and thirty. Said commission shall report to the
14 general court its findings and recommendations, to-
15 gether with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its
16 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with
17 the clerk of the house of representatives on or before
18 December first in the current year, and at the same
19 time shall file a copy thereof with the budget com-
20 missioner.

21 For the purpose of securing a design for said me-
22 morial by means of conducting a competition among
23 architects of Massachusetts, and for such traveling
24 and other expenses, including expert, clerical and
25 other assistance, as may be deemed necessary, subject
26 to the approval of the governor and council, the com-
27 mission may expend such sum, not exceeding five
28 thousand dollars, as the general court may hereafter
29 appropriate, in addition to the unexpended balance of
30 the amount appropriated by item one hundred and
31 fifty-eight bb of chapter four hundred and twenty-six
32 of the acts of nineteen hundred and thirty.
