AN ACT

To authorize the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Board to sell and deliver Water to Concentration Camps established by the United States.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan water and sewer-
2 age board is authorized to sell and deliver water
3 from any of the reservoirs or aqueducts of the
4 metropolitan water system to any concentration
5 camp established in this commonwealth by the
6 United States, and to lay and maintain such pipe
7 lines and others works as may be necessary for the
8 purpose, upon such terms and conditions as may
9 be agreed upon by the duly authorized officer or
10 representative of the United States government
11 and said board.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of chapter four
2 hundred and eighty-eight of the acts of the year
3 eighteen hundred and ninety-five and acts in
4 amendment thereof shall apply to this act.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon
2 its passage.
