AN ACT PROVIDING GROUP INSURANCE TO CERTAIN PERSONS EMPLOYED
AS CALL FIREFIGHTERS IN THE TOWN OF KINGSTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding so much of the provisions of
2 chapter 32B of the General Laws or of any other general or special
3 law or rule to the contrary, any person who was appointed a call
4 firefighter in the town of Kingston prior to January 1, 1985 shall
5 be deemed an "employee" as defined in section two of chapter 32B
6 of the General Laws for the purpose of said chapter 32B and the
7 spouse of each such call firefighter shall be deemed a "dependent"
8 as so defined in said chapter 32B; provided, however, that when
9 any such person ceases to perform the duties of such position of
10 call firefighter, such person and spouse shall be deemed eligible
11 to continue such group general or blanket insurance as a retired
12 employee and his dependent in accordance with the provisions of
13 said chapter 32B.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
