

By Mr. Winston of Boston, petition of James E. Maguire and others that the city of Boston be authorized to lay out, construct and maintain a shore reservation between the World War Memorial Park and the Winthrop line. Municipal Finance. Jan. 16, 1924.

**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Four.

An Act authorizing the City of Boston to Lay out, Construct, and Maintain a Shore Reservation between World War Memorial Park and the Winthrop Line with Parks, Playgrounds, Basins and Channels.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The city of Boston shall lay out, construct,  
2 and maintain for the benefit and use of the people of  
3 East Boston a shore reservation extending from the  
4 World War Memorial Park in East Boston in a general  
5 direction to the north, east and south, following the shore,  
6 to the Winthrop line. The city shall take for such public  
7 use private land and flats to the harbor line, and shall  
8 construct thereon parks or playgrounds or bathing  
9 beaches. The city shall dredge the flats for basins or  
10 channels for the use of boats and yachts.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act the city of  
2 Boston may from time to time borrow such sums as may  
3 be necessary not exceeding in the aggregate one million  
4 dollars and may issue bonds in accordance with the usual  
5 statutory limits as to time and rate, which shall bear on

6 their face the words, Harbor View Shore Bonds, Act of  
7 1924. Indebtedness incurred under this act shall be  
8 outside the statutory limit.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
