The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty.

An Act relative to the Salary of the Members of the City Council of the City of Revere.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section six of chapter six hundred and
2 eighty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and
3 fourteen, as amended by section one of chapter forty-
4 two of the special acts of nineteen hundred and sixteen,
5 is hereby further amended by striking out, in the third
6 line of the last paragraph, the word "three" and in-
7 serting in place thereof the word:— five, — so that
8 said paragraph will read as follows:— The council
9 shall consist of nine members, until it is otherwise pro-
10 vided. The councilmen shall receive such salary, not
11 exceeding five hundred dollars a year, as the city
12 council, with the approval of the mayor, may estab-
13 lish. The members of the school committee shall
14 serve without compensation. At every annual elec-
15 tion thereafter there shall be elected officers to fill
16 vacancies, and to succeed those whose terms will expire
17 upon the first Monday of January following.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for accept-
2 ance to the registered voters of the city of Revere at
3 its city election in the current year in the form of the

4 following question which shall be placed upon the
5 official ballot to be used at said election: "Shall an
6 act passed by the general court in the year nineteen
7 hundred and thirty, entitled 'An Act relative to the
8 salary of the members of the city council of the city
9 of Revere', be accepted?" If a majority of the voters
10 voting thereon vote in the affirmative in answer to said
11 question, this act shall thereupon take effect, but not
12 otherwise.
