AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME FOR FILING APPLICATIONS FOR RELOCATION HOUSING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The third paragraph of section 26RR of chapter 121 of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of chap-
3 ter 572 of the acts of 1958, is hereby further amended by strik-
4 ing out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the fol-
5 lowing sentence:—The provisions of sections twenty-six L
6 to twenty-six PP, except sections twenty-six FF and twenty-
7 six GG, shall, as far as apt, be applicable to projects developed
8 under this section and to housing authorities while engaged
9 in developing and administering such projects; provided, that
10 whenever the phrase, “federal legislation” is used in said sec-
11 tions twenty-six L to twenty-six PP it shall also include legis-
12 lation in respect to a relocation project under this section;
13 and provided, further, that the limitations on the powers of a
14 housing authority with respect to “families of low income”
15 found in sections twenty-six P and twenty-six FF shall not
16 apply to relocation projects; and provided, further, that the
17 provisions of the last sentence of the fifth paragraph of sec-
18 tion twenty-six NN shall not apply to relocation projects but
19 any application for state financial assistance for any such proj-
20 ect may be accepted by the board if such application shall have
21 been received by such board prior to January first, nineteen
22 hundred and seventy.
