Joseph Manning (by vote of the town) for legislation to provide for the permanent appointment of George Cormey, incumbent of the position of office engineer in the engineering department of the town of Randolph. AN ACT PROVIDING PERMANENT APPOINTMENT OF GEORGE CORMEY, INCUMBENT OF THE POSITION OF OFFICE ENGINEER IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF RANDOLPH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 George Cormey, incumbent of the position of office engineer
2 in the engineering department of the town of Randolph shall be
3 subjected by the division of civil service to a qualifying
4 examination, and if he passes said examination, he shall be
5 deemed to be permanently appointed to said position without
6 being required to serve any probationary period, and he shall not
7 be removed therefrom or lowered in compensation except after a
8 hearing in the manner provided in section forty-three of chapter
9 thirty-one of the General Laws. If he fails to pass said
10 examination, he may continue to serve in said position but shall
11 not be subject to the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the
12 General Laws.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF LIFE INSURANCE COMPANIES
 IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK, AS AMENDED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK,
 That the following be and the same be the laws of the State of New York:

Section 1. The National Life Insurance Company of the United States, a
 corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York, and
 authorized to do business in this State, shall be and it is hereby
 declared to be a life insurance company within the meaning of the
 provisions of this chapter, and shall be subject to the provisions of
 this chapter in all respects as if it were a life insurance company
 organized under the laws of this State.
