## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

### AN ACT OUTLAWING COMPUTERIZED TELEPHONE SOLICITATIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 14A of Chapter 269 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph: —
- 3 Whoever telephones another person, or causes any person to
- 4 be telephoned to, by means of a computerized telephone
- 5 solicitation machine or mechanism of any type, for the sole or
- 6 primary purpose of soliciting a product or service from or for said
- 7 person, regardless of profit or nonprofit, shall be punished by a
- 8 fine of not more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment
- 9 for not more than three months, or both.
