## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

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1    SECT. 2.  When any corporation established under  
2 authority of said chapter sixty-one of the General  
3 Statutes shall suspend its corporate action, or from  
4 any cause shall cease to act as such corporate body,  
5 the president, treasurer and a majority of the directors  
6 of such corporation at the time of so suspending its  
7 functions, shall make to the secretary of the Com-  
8 monwealth, within sixty days thereafter, a duly  
9 attested certificate that said corporation, on a given  
10 day and from certain cause, did suspend such action  
11 so far as corporate persons might so do, or became  
12 defunct as such body by judicial decree; and the  
13 secretary shall make of record such certificate.
