## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-One.

### AN ACT

To annex a Part of the Town of Natick to the Town of Framingham.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—*

1    SECT. 1.   So much of the town of Natick as lies  
2 west and south-west of the following described line is  
3 hereby annexed to the town of Framingham, to wit:  
4 beginning at the stone monument which is the bound  
5 between the towns of Natick and Sherborn, situate  
6 on the north side of the highway known as the cen-  
7 tral turnpike, and running thence due north two  
8 hundred and eighty-seven rods to a point on the line  
9 between said towns of Natick and Framingham.

1    SECT. 2.   The inhabitants upon the territory hereby  
2 annexed to the town of Framingham shall continue

3 to be a part of the town of Natick for the purpose of  
4 electing representatives to the general court until the  
5 next apportionment shall be made; and it shall be  
6 the duty of the selectmen of Framingham to make a  
7 true list of the persons residing on the territory hereby  
8 annexed qualified to vote at such elections, as re-  
9 quired by law, and deliver the same to the selectmen  
10 of said town of Natick seven days at least before any  
11 such election, and the same shall be taken and used  
12 by the selectmen of Natick for such elections.

1     SECT. 3. The town of Framingham shall pay to  
2 the town of Natick, within three months from the  
3 passage of this act, the sum of two thousand dollars.

1     SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
