AN ACT

In Addition to an Act making Appropriations for
Sundry Charitable Expenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 six months ending on the thirty-first day of De-
6 cember, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-
7 seven, the same to be in addition to any amounts
8 heretofore appropriated for the same purpose, to
9 wit:

STATE BOARD OF LUNACY AND CHARITY.

10 For expenses of the state board of lunacy and
11 charity, including traveling and other necessary
12 expenses of members, and salary and expenses of
13 the clerk and auditor of said board, a sum not ex-

14 ceeding thirty-five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
15 chap. 69; Acts 1897, chap. 374.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$5,000.)

16 For salaries and expenses in the department
17 of the indoor poor, a sum not exceeding twenty
18 thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$40,000.)

19 For salaries and expenses in the department of
20 the out-door poor, a sum not exceeding twelve thou-
21 sand five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$24,300.)

22 For salaries and expenses in the department of
23 the inspector of institutions, a sum not exceeding
24 fifty-five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$12,000.)

25 For traveling and other necessary expenses of
26 the auxiliary visitors of the state board of lunacy
27 and charity, a sum not exceeding seven hundred
28 and fifty dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 79.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$1,500.)

MISCELLANEOUS CHARITABLE.

29 For transportation of state paupers, a sum not
30 exceeding ten thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap.
31 86, sec. 22; Acts 1887, chap. 367.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$20,000.)

32 For the support and relief of state paupers in
33 state lunatic hospitals and asylums of the Common-
34 wealth, and of state lunatic paupers boarded out
35 in families, for the present and previous years, a
36 sum not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars.
37 [Pub. Stat., chap. 385.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$190,000.)

38 For the care and maintenance of indigent and
39 neglected children and juvenile offenders, to in-
40 clude expenses in connection with the same, a
41 sum not exceeding forty-seven thousand dollars.
42 [Acts 1882, chap. 181.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$80,000.)

43 For the support of state paupers in the Massa-
44 chusetts school for the feeble-minded and the
45 hospital cottages for children, a sum not exceed-
46 ing forty-two hundred and fifty dollars. [Acts
47 1886, chap. 298; 1889, chap. 230.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$10,000.)

48 For expenses in connection with small-pox and
49 other diseases dangerous to the public health, for
50 the present and previous years, a sum not ex-
51 ceeding fifteen hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
52 chap. 80.]

(Appropriation 1896, \$3,000.)

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
