## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nine.

### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Office of the Prison Commissioners and for Sundry Reformatory Expenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are  
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the  
3 commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the  
4 purposes specified for the fiscal year ending on the  
5 thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and  
6 nine, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the chairman of the prison  
8 commissioners, four thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws,  
9 chap. 222, sect. 1.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$4,000.)

10 For the salary of the secretary of the prison com-  
11 missioners, twenty-five hundred dollars. (Rev.  
12 Laws, chap. 222, sect. 2.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$2,500.)

13 For clerical assistance in the office of the prison

14 commissioners, a sum not exceeding forty-eight  
15 hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, chap. 222, sect. 2.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$4,800.)

16 For the salaries of the agents of the prison com-  
17 missioners, fifty-two hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws,  
18 chap. 225, sect. 136.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$5,200.)

19 For travelling expenses of the prison commis-  
20 sioners and of the secretary and agents of said  
21 commissioners, a sum not exceeding three thou-  
22 sand dollars. (Rev. Laws, chap. 222.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$3,000.)

23 For incidental and contingent expenses of the  
24 prison commissioners, including printing and bind-  
25 ing the annual report, a sum not exceeding twenty-  
26 seven hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, chap. 222;  
27 Acts 1902, chap. 438.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$2,700.)

28 For the salary of the agent for aiding discharged  
29 female prisoners, one thousand dollars. (Rev.  
30 Laws, chap. 225, sect. 137.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,000.)

31 For the expenses of the agent for aiding dis-  
32 charged female prisoners, including assistance  
33 rendered to said prisoners, a sum not exceeding  
34 three thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, chap. 225,  
35 sect. 137.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$3,000.)

36 For aiding prisoners discharged from the Mas-  
37 sachusetts reformatory, a sum not exceeding five  
38 thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, chap. 225, sect.  
39 136.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$5,000.)

40 For aiding prisoners discharged from the state

41 prison, a sum not exceeding three thousand dol-  
42 lars. (Rev. Laws, chap. 225, sect. 136.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$3,000.)

43 For expenses incurred in removing prisoners to  
44 and from state and county prisons, a sum not ex-  
45 ceeding twenty-one hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws,  
46 chap. 225, sect. 108.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$2,100.)

47 For expenses in connection with the identification  
48 of criminals, a sum not exceeding nineteen hundred  
49 dollars. (Acts 1905, chap. 459.)

(Appropriation 1908, \$1,900.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
