Bill accompanying the petition of Thomas I. Gasson and others that a certain parcel of land in the city of Newton be annexed to the city of Boston. Cities. January 25.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ten.

AN ACT

To provide for the Annexation of a Certain Tract of Land in the City of Newton to the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. So much of the city of Newton, in the
2 county of Middlesex, with all the inhabitants and estates
3 therein as is substantially bounded as follows, viz. :—
4 beginning at an angle in the boundary line between Bos-
5 ton and Newton, marked by a stone monument, situated
6 in the northerly line of Commonwealth avenue, and about
7 one hundred and twenty feet west of Lake street; thence
8 running southerly two hundred and ninety-eight and sev-
9 enty-nine hundredths feet to a stone monument; thence
10 turning and running southwesterly four hundred and
11 eighty-two and seventy-three hundredths feet to a stone
12 monument; thence continuing southwesterly, a little more
13 westerly sixty-six and sixty-eight hundredths feet to a

14 stone monument; thence continuing southwesterly, a little
15 more southerly one hundred and five feet to a stone mon-
16 ument; thence continuing southwesterly, a little more
17 southerly, one hundred and fifty-eight and twenty-six
18 hundredths feet to a stone monument; thence turning and
19 running southerly, two hundred and fifty-three feet to a
20 stone monument; thence continuing southerly, a little
21 more easterly three hundred and ninety-six and eighty-
22 eight hundredths feet to a stone monument; thence turn-
23 ing and running southwesterly one hundred and seventy-
24 four and fifty hundredths feet to a stone monument;
25 thence turning and running southeasterly two hundred
26 and sixty-three and forty hundredths feet to a stone mon-
27 ument; thence continuing southeasterly, a little more east-
28 erly, one hundred and sixty-four and eighty hundredths feet
29 to a stone monument; thence continuing southeasterly, a lit-
30 tle more southerly five hundred and fifty-two and twenty-
31 two hundredths feet to a stone monument situated in
32 the southeasterly line of Beacon street (the monuments
33 mentioned in the above description mark corners in the
34 present boundary line between Boston and Newton);
35 thence turning and running southwesterly by the south-
36 easterly line of Beacon street thirteen hundred and eighty-
37 two feet to Hammond street; thence turning and running
38 northwesterly across Beacon street sixty-five and thirty
39 hundredths feet to the northeasterly corner of Beacon
40 street and Hammond street; thence continuing north-
41 westerly, a little more northerly, by the northeasterly line
42 of Hammond street, ninety-six and fifty hundredths feet
43 to the junction of Hammond street and South street;
44 thence turning and running northeasterly, northerly, and
45 northwesterly, by the southeasterly and easterly line of
46 South street fifteen hundred and eighty hundredths feet
47 to a tangent point in a curve at the junction of South

48 street and Commonwealth avenue; thence continuing
49 northwesterly across Commonwealth avenue two hundred
50 and forty-six and thirty-six hundredths feet to a point in
51 the northwesterly line of Commonwealth avenue; thence
52 turning and running northeasterly on a curve to the left,
53 having a radius of three hundred and eighty-five and four
54 hundredths feet, one hundred and thirty-eight and twenty-
55 nine hundredths feet; thence continuing northeasterly on
56 a curve to the left, having a radius of three thousand and
57 sixty-five and seventeen hundredths feet, one hundred and
58 ninety-nine and ninety-three hundredths feet; thence con-
59 tinuing northeasterly on a curve to the right, having a
60 radius of two thousand nine hundred and twenty-three
61 and fifty-nine hundredths feet, two hundred and ten and
62 ninety-one hundredths feet; thence continuing northeast-
63 erly on a curve to the right, having a radius of thirteen
64 hundred and eighty-one feet; seven hundred and nineteen
65 and forty-seven hundredths feet; thence continuing north-
66 easterly on a curve to the right, having a radius of four
67 thousand three hundred and thirteen and ten hundredths
68 feet, five hundred and ninety-eight and ninety-six hun-
69 dredths feet to the point of beginning (the line as de-
70 scribed by the last five measurements, constitutes the
71 northwesterly line of Commonwealth avenue); the above
72 described parcel contains about forty-eight and ninety-
73 four hundredths acres, — is hereby set off and separated
74 from the city of Newton and annexed to and made a part
75 of the city of Boston, in the county of Suffolk, and shall
76 constitute a part of the twenty-fifth ward thereof until a
77 new division of wards is made.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
