AN ACT

Making Appropriations for certain Educational purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECT. 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned in
2 this section are appropriated, and shall be paid out
3 of the moiety of the income of the school fund
4 applicable to educational purposes, to wit:—

5 For the support of normal schools, including
6 the normal art-school, a sum not exceeding
7 seventy-six thousand dollars. [Acts 1870, chap.
8 106.]

9 For teachers' institutes, a sum not exceeding
10 three thousand dollars, to be expended in accord-
11 ance with the provisions of chapter thirty-five of
12 the General Statutes.

13 For the Massachusetts Teachers' Association,
14 three hundred dollars.

1 SECT. 2. The sums hereinafter mentioned in
2 this section, are appropriated and shall be paid
3 from the treasury of the Commonwealth, to wit:—

4 For expenses of the members of the board of
5 education, a sum not exceeding three hundred dol-
6 lars. [Gen. Stat., chap. 34.]

7 For county teachers' associations, a sum not
8 exceeding three hundred dollars. [Acts 1864,
9 chap. 58.]

10 For postage, printing, stationery, advertising,
11 transportation of documents for the board of edu-
12 cation and the secretary thereof, a sum not exceed-
13 ing four thousand dollars. [Gen. Stat., chap. 34.]

14 For printing the annual and supplementary
15 reports of the board of education, with the accom-
16 panying documents, a sum not exceeding ten
17 thousand dollars.

18 For salaries of agents of the board of educa-
19 tion, a sum not exceeding eighteen thousand dol-
20 lars. [Gen. Stat., chap. 34.]

21 For the Perkins institution and Massachusetts
22 asylum for the blind, the sum of thirty thousand
23 dollars. [Res. 1869, chap. 19.]

24 For the support of Massachusetts beneficiaries
25 in the asylums for the deaf and dumb, and in other
26 institutions of the same character, a sum not
27 exceeding thirty thousand dollars. [Res. 1847,
28 chap. 94; 1864, chap. 38; 1865, chap. 50; Acts
29 1869, chap. 333.]

1 SECT. 3. The income of the Rogers book fund
2 shall be expended in accordance with the condi-
3 tions named by the donor, in conformity with

4 chapter two hundred and fifteen of the acts of
5 eighteen hundred and fifty-nine.

6 The income of the Todd normal school fund shall
7 be paid to the treasurer of the board of education,
8 to be applied by said board in accordance with
9 chapter thirty-six of the General Statutes.

10 The income of the agricultural college fund
11 shall be paid in accordance with the provisions of
12 chapters one hundred and eighty-six and two hun-
13 dred and twenty of the acts of eighteen hundred
14 and sixty-three.

1 SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
