AN ACT

Making appropriations from the Moiety of the Income of
the School Fund applicable to Educational Purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—*

1 SECT. 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned in this
2 section are appropriated and shall be allowed and
3 paid out of the moiety of the income of the school
4 fund applicable to educational purposes, on the war-
5 rant of the governor for the year one thousand eight
6 hundred and sixty-one.

7 For the support of the four State normal schools
8 for the current year, under the direction of the board
9 of education, the sum of fourteen thousand five hun-
10 dred dollars.

11 For the Massachusetts Teachers' Association, the

12 sum of three hundred dollars, on condition that said
13 association shall furnish a copy of the Massachusetts
14 Teacher to each school committee in the several cities
15 and towns of the Commonwealth during the year
16 eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and furnish satisfac-
17 tory evidence thereof to the auditor of the Common-
18 wealth.

19 For the Massachusetts Teachers' Association, the
20 sum of three hundred dollars, to be paid to the presi-
21 dent or treasurer of the association in the month of
22 August next, to be applied to the purposes of said
23 association.

24 For the American Institute of Instruction the sum
25 of three hundred dollars, to be paid to the president
26 or treasurer of said institute in the month of August
27 next.

28 For postage, printing, advertising, stationery, me-
29 teorological observations, and all other incidental ex-
30 penses of the board of education or of the secretary
31 thereof, and also for any contingent expenses of the
32 normal schools not otherwise herein provided for, a
33 sum not exceeding fifty-six hundred dollars.

34 For the salary of the secretary of the board of ed-
35 ucation, two thousand dollars.

36 For the support of one or more agents of the board
37 of education, in accordance with chapter thirty-four,
38 section nine, of the General Statutes, a sum not ex-
39 ceeding twenty-five hundred dollars.

40 For teachers' institutes, in accordance with chapter
41 thirty-five, section two, of the General Statutes, the
42 sum of twenty-eight hundred dollars.

43 For the support of State scholarships, in accordance
44 with chapter thirty-seven of the General Statutes, the

45 sum of forty-five hundred dollars, in addition to the
46 sum of three hundred dollars now in the hands of the
47 treasurer of the board of education, which he is hereby
48 authorized to apply to the same purpose.

49 For aid to pupils in the State normal schools, in
50 accordance with the resolves of the year one thousand
51 eight hundred and fifty-three, chapter sixty-two, a sum
52 not exceeding four thousand dollars.

53 For the expenses of the secretary of the board of
54 education, in accordance with chapter thirty-four,
55 section eight, of the General Statutes, a sum not ex-
56 ceeding four hundred dollars.

57 For the expenses of the members of the board of
58 education, in accordance with the provisions of chap-
59 ter thirty-four, section ten, of the General Statutes, a
60 sum not exceeding two hundred dollars.

61 For the support of certain Indian schools, in accord-
62 ance with the provisions of chapter thirty-six, section
63 five, the sum of four hundred and five dollars.

64 For county associations of teachers, in accordance
65 with chapter thirty-five, section four, of the General
66 Statutes, a sum not exceeding six hundred dollars.

67 For the enlargement and repairs of the Bridgewater
68 Normal School, a sum not exceeding four thousand
69 five hundred dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
