AN ACT

In addition to an Act to Establish the City of Lynn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The mayor and aldermen of the city of
2 Lynn, with the concurrent vote of the common
3 council, shall have exclusive authority and power to
4 lay out, alter or discontinue, any street or town way
5 to establish the grade thereof, and to estimate the
6 damages any individual or party may sustain thereby ;
7 and the person or party, dissatisfied with the decision
8 of the city council, in the estimate of damages, may
9 make complaint to the county commissioners of the
10 county of Essex, at any meeting held within one year
11 after such decision, whereupon the same proceedings
12 shall be had as are now by law provided, in cases

13 where persons or parties are aggrieved by the assess-
14 ment of damages by the selectmen, in the forty-third
15 chapter of the General Statutes.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
