AN ACT

To incorporate the Wheelwright Scientific School.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1 SECTION 1. Robert Codman, Eben F. Stone,
2 Charles G. Wood, William B. Atkinson, and the
3 mayor of the city of Newburyport for the time
4 being, their associates and successors, are hereby
5 made a corporation by the name of the "Wheel-
6 wright Scientific School," for the purpose of estab-
7 lishing a scientific school in said Newburyport, or
8 assisting young men of that city as provided in the
9 will of William Wheelwright, deceased, to obtain a
10 scientific education, with all the powers and privi-
11 leges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions, and
12 liabilities, set forth in all general laws which now are
13 or may hereafter be in force and applicable to such
14 corporations.

1 SECT. 2. The said corporation shall have au-
2 thority to receive, hold, and manage the fund be-
3 queathed for the purposes for which the said corpo-
4 ration is created by the will of William Wheelwright,
5 late of Newburyport, deceased, and any other dona-
6 tions or bequests which may be made for its benefit,
7 and may hold for the purposes aforesaid real and
8 personal estate to an amount not exceeding three
9 hundred thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 3. The officers of said corporation shall
2 consist of the trustees under said will one of whom
3 shall be president; also a treasurer and a secretary,
4 who may or may not be members of said board of
5 trustees.

6 Whenever a trustee shall die or resign, or become
7 incompetent to discharge the duties of his trust, a
8 successor shall be elected by ballot by the remaining
9 trustees; but no person so elected shall have any
10 authority to act as trustee until approved as such by
11 the judge of probate for the county of Essex.

1 SECT. 4. The said institution shall be established
2 in said Newburyport, and shall be conducted and
3 managed in accordance with the provisions of the
4 will of said William Wheelwright.

5 It shall, as often as once in three years, and oftener
6 when thereto requested, render to the probate court
7 for the county of Essex, and also to the city of
8 Newburyport, an account of all receipts and disburse-
9 ments of the said trust fund.

1 SECT. 5. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
