AN ACT CONCERNING THE SALARIES OF THE CLERK AND SECOND ASSISTANT CLERK OF THE POLICE COURT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Chap. 100

*Be it enacted, &c., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The clerk of the police court of the city of Boston shall receive an annual salary of two thousand dollars, and the second assistant clerk of said court shall receive an annual salary of fifteen hundred dollars, from the treasury of the Commonwealth.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on the second day of June next.

AN ACT RELATING TO THE COMPENSATION OF SUPERINTENDENTS OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Chap. 101

*Be it enacted, &c., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The compensation of superintendents of public schools, provided for in the thirty-fifth section of the thirty-eighth chapter of the General Statutes, passed December twenty-eighth, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, shall in no case be less than one dollar and fifty cents for each day of actual service.

Compensation per day for actual service.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE PEMBERTON COMPANY.

Chap. 102

*Be it enacted, &c., as follows:*

SECTION 1. David Nevins, George Blackburn, Eben Sutton, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Pemberton Company, for the purpose of manufacturing cotton, woollen, linen and silk cloth and yarn, in the city of Lawrence, in the county of Essex; and for this purpose shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities, set forth in the thirty-eighth and forty-fourth chapters of the Revised Statutes, the two hundred and seventy-sixth chapter of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, and all acts passed subsequent thereto, relating to manufacturing corporations.
