

two hundred dollars a year, and that of the assistant register of probate and insolvency for the same county two thousand dollars a year, to be so allowed from the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT IN ADDITION TO AN ACT RELATING TO THE ADULTERATION
OF FOOD AND DRUGS.

Chap.319

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of chapter two hundred and sixty-three of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-two, relating to the adulteration of food and drugs, the state board of health may expend annually a sum not exceeding eleven thousand five hundred dollars: *provided, however,* that not less than three fifths of said amount shall be annually expended for the enforcement of the laws against the adulteration of milk and milk products.

May expend annually not exceeding \$11,500.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. Section one of chapter two hundred and eighty-nine of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four is hereby repealed.

Repeal.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO ENABLE THE TOWN OF WATERTOWN TO ISSUE BONDS,
NOTES OR SCRIP FOR SEWERAGE PURPOSES.

Chap.320

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. To provide for the indebtedness incurred and to be incurred by the provisions of chapter four hundred and thirty-nine of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, entitled "an act to provide for the building, maintenance and operation of a system of sewage disposal for the Mystic and Charles river valleys", the town of Watertown is hereby authorized, in conformity with the provisions of chapter one hundred and twenty-nine of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, to issue from time to time scrip, notes, bonds or other certificates of indebtedness, to be denominated on the face thereof Watertown Sewerage Bonds, to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, with interest thereon, redeemable in twenty years from the date of issue.

Town may issue scrip, bonds, etc., not exceeding \$100,000.
