

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE SALARY OF THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH. *Chap. 589*

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Beginning with the fiscal year, the secretary of the commonwealth shall receive an annual salary of six thousand dollars, and the expense of procuring the bonds which the secretary is required to give shall be paid by the commonwealth. Salary established.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC EVENING SCHOOLS. *Chap. 590*

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter forty-two of the Revised Laws is hereby amended by striking out section eleven and inserting in place thereof the following new section:— *Section 11.* Any town may, and every city or town in which there are issued during the year from September first to August thirty-first certificates authorizing the employment of twenty or more persons who do not possess the educational qualifications enumerated in section one of chapter forty-four of the Revised Laws, as amended, shall maintain during the following school year an evening school or schools for the instruction of persons over fourteen years of age in orthography, reading, writing, the English language and grammar, geography, arithmetic, industrial drawing, both free hand and mechanical, the history of the United States, physiology and hygiene and good behavior. Such other subjects may be taught in such schools as the school committee considers expedient. R. L. 42, § 11, amended. Public evening schools.

AN ACT TO REVIVE THE CHARTER OF THE OLD COLONY THEATRE, INC. *Chap. 591*

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and forty-four of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and fourteen, in so far as it applies to or affects the Old Colony Theatre, Inc., is hereby repealed; and all conveyances to and acts done by the said Charter revived.
