

Chap.147 AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE LOCATION OF THE BEACH AND BATH HOUSE TO BE CONSTRUCTED NEAR OLD COLONY PARKWAY AT SAVIN HILL IN THE DORCHESTER DISTRICT OF BOSTON.

Emergency
preamble.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section one of chapter four hundred and twenty-two of the acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-five is hereby amended by striking out all after the word "on" in the ninth line and inserting in place thereof the words:— such portion of said land as it may determine, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 1.* The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized and directed to improve for park purposes the land owned by the commonwealth and located on the easterly and westerly sides of Old Colony parkway between Savin Hill and Freeport street in the Dorchester district of the city of Boston, by grading, loaming, seeding and planting said land and by doing all such other work thereon as the commission deems desirable, and to construct a beach and public bath house on such portion of said land as it may determine.

Chap.148 AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH A JUDICIAL DECREE MAY BE RENDERED RELATIVE TO THE TRANSFER OF THE TAGGART FUND, SO CALLED, TO THE TOWN OF BLANDFORD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter one hundred and twenty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-five is hereby amended by striking out, in the fourth line, the words "one year" and inserting in place thereof the words:— two years, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 2.* The power hereby granted shall be exercised only in conformity with such a decree, if any, of the supreme judicial court, sitting in equity for the county of Hampden, as may be entered within two years after the passage of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
