

at the time of their purchase legal investments for savings banks in this commonwealth, or, to the extent authorized by section three of chapter two hundred and sixteen of the acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-two, in the shares of Central Credit Union Fund, Inc., or in the shares of co-operative banks incorporated in this commonwealth, or in shares of federal savings and loan associations having a usual place of business within the commonwealth to an amount not to exceed five thousand dollars in any one of such associations, but not more than five per cent of the assets, but in any case not to exceed fifteen thousand dollars, of a credit union shall be invested in bank stocks at any one time.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR INDEMNIFICATION OF POLICE CHAUFFEURS IN THE CITY OF LOWELL FOR CERTAIN EXPENSES OR DAMAGES INCURRED BY THEM. Chap.247

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The provisions of section one hundred of chapter forty-one of the General Laws shall apply to certain employees of the police department in the city of Lowell known as police chauffeurs.

SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its acceptance by vote of the city council of the city of Lowell, subject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE HOURS OF DUTY OF PERMANENT MEMBERS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT IN THE CITY OF NEWBURYPORT. Chap.248

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The hours of duty of the permanent members of the uniformed fire fighting force in the city of Newburyport shall be so established by the chief of the fire department that the average weekly hours of duty in any year, other than hours during which such members may be summoned and kept on duty because of conflagrations, shall not exceed forty-eight in number. Sections fifty-six, fifty-seven, fifty-eight A and fifty-nine of chapter forty-eight of the General Laws shall not apply to the permanent members of the uniformed fire fighting force in said city.

SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to the voters of said city at its next biennial municipal election in the form of the following question, which shall be placed upon the official ballot to be used at said election: — "Shall an act passed by the general court in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-one, providing for a forty-eight hour week for the permanent members of the fire department of this city, be accepted?" If a majority of the votes in answer to said question is in the affirmative, then this act shall thereupon take full effect, but not otherwise.
