Chap.373 AN ACT RELATIVE TO SICK LEAVE FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

G. L. (Ter. Ed.), 92, § 10, etc., amended.

Sick leave for certain employees, regulated.

Paragraph (10) of section 10 of chapter 92 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the fourth sentence, as appearing in chapter 243 of the acts of 1946, the two following sentences:— Any employee so transferring shall retain all available sick leave credits accrued by him at the time of such transfer, except that he shall not be credited with any accumulated sick leave allowance in excess of ninety days. In order to be credited with such available sick leave allowance an employee must submit to his department head a sworn statement of such available allowance executed by the appropriate official of the town from which he transferred.

Chap.374 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO CONTRACT WITH THE BOSTON SOCIETY OF NATURAL HISTORY FOR USE OF THE FACILITIES OF THE MUSEUM OF SCIENCE BY SCHOOL CHILDREN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized to contract with the Boston Society of Natural History for use of the facilities of the museum of science by children attending schools located within the metropolitan parks district. For said purposes, said commission may expend such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

Chap.375 AN ACT TO ASCERTAIN THE WILL OF THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF NORTHAMPTON WITH REFERENCE TO THE QUESTION OF FLUORINATING THE PUBLIC DOMESTIC WATER SUPPLY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of ascertaining the will of the voters of the city of Northampton with reference to the question of fluorinating the public domestic water supply of said city, there shall be placed upon the official ballot to be used at the biennial city election in said city in the current year the following question:— “Shall the public domestic water supply in this city be fluorinated?” If a majority of the votes in answer to said question is in the affirmative, it shall be deemed and taken to be the will of the voters of said city that the public domestic water supply in said city shall be fluorinated, and if a majority of said votes is in the negative,
