Chap. 159. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF NANTUCKET TO ESTABLISH IN THE TOWN TREASURY A PARK AND RECREATION COMMISSION REVOLVING FUND.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Nantucket may establish in the town treasury a revolving fund in which shall be deposited the receipts of the park and recreation commission created by the town under the provisions of section fourteen of chapter forty-five of the General Laws. Any and all such funds received by the town treasurer shall be kept separate from any other moneys, funds or property of the town, and the principal and interest thereof shall be expended at the direction of the park and recreation commission, without further appropriation, in such manner and at such times as shall in the discretion of the park and recreation commission best serve and promote the purposes for which such commission was established, the provisions of section fifty-three of chapter forty-four of the General Laws notwithstanding.

SECTION 2. The acceptance of this act by the voters of the town of Nantucket at its town meeting in the current year shall be as valid and effective as though this act were in full force and effect at the time of the posting of the warrant for said meeting.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by a majority vote of the voters of said town present and voting thereon at the annual or any special town meeting called for the purpose during the current year.

Chap. 160. AN ACT PROVIDING LIFE TENURE FOR N. ELLSWORTH WILLIAMS, THE INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF SUPERVISOR OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF MARSHFIELD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The tenure of office of N. Ellsworth Williams, the incumbent of the office of supervisor of the highway department in the town of Marshfield, shall, on the effective date of this act, be unlimited and he shall hold office during good behavior unless incapacitated by physical or mental disability from performing the duties of said office and until the board of road commissioners shall remove him therefrom for cause after hearing in the manner provided by section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to the voters of said town at the annual town meeting in the current year, or in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-two, in the form of the following question which shall be placed upon the official ballot to be used for the election of town officers:— "Shall an act passed by the General Court
