

Chap. 800. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF NATICK TO APPROPRIATE AND PAY A CERTAIN SUM OF MONEY TO GEORGE F. ROBERTS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Natick is hereby authorized to appropriate seven hundred and seventy-two dollars to indemnify George F. Roberts for expenses incurred by him in securing a writ of mandamus commanding the selectmen of said town to include Article 85 in the warrant for the annual town meeting of nineteen hundred and sixty-five, and after such appropriation the town treasurer of said town is hereby authorized to pay such sum to the said George F. Roberts.

SECTION 2. No bill shall be approved by the town comptroller of said town or paid by the treasurer thereof under authority of this act, unless and until the recipient thereof has signed a certificate and filed the same with said town comptroller stating under the penalties of perjury that he incurred expenses for the purposes set forth in section one, and to the amount so stated.

SECTION 3. Any person who knowingly files a certificate, required by section two, which is false and thereby receives a sum of money which is greater than the sum expended by him for the purposes set forth in section one shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year or by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars.

Chap. 801. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ENTRY OF THE COMMONWEALTH INTO THE NEW ENGLAND COMPACT ON RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH PROTECTION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. This act may be cited as the New England Compact on Radiological Health Protection.

SECTION 2. A compact is hereby entered into with all jurisdictions legally joining therein in substantially the following form:—

NEW ENGLAND COMPACT
ON
RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH PROTECTION.

Article I. Purposes.— The purposes of this compact are to:

1. Promote the radiological health protection of the public and individuals within the party States.
2. Provide mutual aid and assistance in radiological health matters including, but not limited to, radiation incidents.
3. Encourage and facilitate the efficient use of personnel and equipment by furthering the orderly acquisition and sharing of resources useful for programs of radiation protection.

Article II. Enactment.— This compact shall become effective when enacted into law by any two or more of the States of Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont. Thereafter it shall become effective with respect to any other aforementioned State upon its enacting this compact into law. Any State
