

seventy-three. Any vacancy in such board shall be filled in like manner for the unexpired portion of the term. Upon the initial organization of the board of health pursuant to the authority contained in this act, the board of health of said town then in existence shall cease to exercise the powers and duties of a board of health.

Chap. 80. AN ACT DESIGNATING A CERTAIN BRIDGE TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN THE CITY OF TAUNTON AS THE JOHN JOSEPH DONOHUE MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The bridge to be constructed over the Taunton river in the vicinity of Dean street and Longmeadow road in the city of Taunton shall, upon completion, be known and designated as the John Joseph Donohue Memorial bridge, in memory of John Joseph Donohue, who was killed in action while a member of the armed forces of the United States in the Vietnam campaign. Suitable markers bearing said designation shall be attached thereto by the department of public works.

Chap. 81. AN ACT PROVIDING THAT REGISTERED CHIROPRACTORS MAY ORGANIZE PROFESSIONAL CORPORATIONS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Paragraph (b) of section 1 of chapter 156A of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 113 of the acts of 1971, is hereby further amended by inserting after the word "surgeons", in line 2, the word:—, chiropractors.

Chap. 82. AN ACT PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE LAWS RESTRICTING HEAVY TRUCKS TO THE RIGHT-HAND TRAVEL LANES ON MULTI-LANE HIGHWAYS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 89 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 5, as most recently amended by chapter 143 of the acts of 1970, and inserting in place thereof the following section:—

Section 5. Whoever violates any of the provisions of sections one to four C, inclusive, shall, upon complaint made within three months after the commission of the offence, forfeit not more than twenty dollars; provided, however, that the provisions of said sections shall not apply to a person acting in conformity with the direction of a police officer or to a driver of a vehicle actually engaged in authorized work upon a highway under construction, repair or during maintenance operations when the nature of the work necessitates a departure from normal operational practices.
