

for the benefit of said religious organizations, however described, shall vest in the corporation created by section one.

SECTION 8. All documents, records, books and papers of said voluntary religious association and the Central Baptist Society in Middleborough shall be the property of the corporation created by section one, which shall have and enjoy all franchises, powers and privileges of every kind now or formerly belonging to said voluntary religious association and said the Central Baptist Society in Middleborough and said corporation created by section one shall assume and be subject to all debts and liabilities of said voluntary religious association and said society.

SECTION 9. The first meeting of the corporation created by section one shall be held within ninety days following the passage of this act, for the adoption of by-laws consistent with law for the regulation of its government as a religious corporation. *Approved May 25, 1972.*

Chap. 329. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF QUINCY TO APPROPRIATE AND PAY A CERTAIN SUM OF MONEY TO EDWARD DELGIZZI FOR CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, the city of Quincy is hereby authorized to appropriate and pay to Edward DelGizzi, a member of the fire department of said city, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars for certain educational benefits which were due to him in the year nineteen hundred and seventy-one under the provisions of a contract between said city and Local 792 International Association of Firefighters, AFL-CIO. *Approved May 25, 1972.*

Chap. 330. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TENURE OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE LOWELL TECHNOLOGICAL INSTITUTE OF MASSACHUSETTS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 75A of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph, as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 739 of the acts of 1968, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

The trustees shall elect the president and members of the professional staff of the institute as they may determine necessary and shall define their duties and tenure of office without limitation of any other provision of law. The trustees shall have complete authority with respect to the election or appointment of the professional staff including terms, conditions and periods of employment, compensation, promotion, classification and reclassification, transfer, demotion and dismissal within funds available by appropriation of the general court or from other sources. The trustees shall establish and make public a policy on tenure for the professional staff of the institute which provides for removal for just cause, hearing upon dismissal and judicial review; provided, however, that no member of the professional teaching staff shall be retained after the seventh year of consecutive service without being

granted tenure. A leave of absence to a professional teaching staff member for the purpose of advanced study at an educational institution shall not be considered a break in service of consecutive years. A leave of absence for advanced study shall not be counted as a year of service.

SECTION 2. The provisions of section twelve of chapter seventy-five A of the General Laws, as amended by section one of this act, shall apply to officers and members of the professional staff of the Lowell Technological Institute of Massachusetts employed on and after the effective date of this act, and nothing in this act shall be construed so as to impair the seniority, tenure, retirement or other rights of any officer or member of said professional staff who on said effective date were so employed. The provisions of said section twelve in effect prior to the effective date of this act shall continue to apply to any officer or member of the professional staff who were employed at the Lowell Technological Institute of Massachusetts on the effective date hereof.

Chap. 331. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGES TO MAKE RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING PARKING ON CAMPUS OR OTHER LAND OF REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 15 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 39 the following section: —

Section 39A. The board shall make rules and regulations for the control, movement and parking of vehicles on the campus or other land of a regional community college and may provide reasonable penalties for the violation of said rules and regulations. The board may appoint as police officers persons in the employ of such college who in the enforcement of said rules and regulations and throughout the property of such college shall have the powers of police officers, except as to service of civil process. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all fines and penalties recovered for violation of rules and regulations made under authority of this section shall be accounted for by the clerk of the court and forwarded to the state treasurer, who shall deposit such fines and penalties in the state treasury in a special fund to be known as the Regional Community Colleges Scholarship Fund which shall be used, subject to appropriation, for the purpose of granting scholarships to worthy students as the board shall determine.

Chap. 332. AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE CLERK OF THE THIRD DISTRICT COURT OF PLYMOUTH.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Class I of paragraph (1) of section 79 of chapter 218 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 668 of the acts of 1971, is hereby amended by inserting after the line reading "second
