

manner as orders by county commissioners are now by law enforced.

The assessment herein provided for upon any cities or towns may be made by the proper officers thereof, for the present year, at any time before the tax lists are committed to the several collectors, and the assessment shall be taken as made of the first day of May of said year. And any assessment that shall be or that has been made during the present year under the provisions of chapter ninety-nine of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, is hereby declared null and void.

Assessments for the present year.

SECTION 4. If either of said commissioners shall reside in the city of Charlestown, or in either of the towns of Malden, Melrose, Wakefield, Reading, North Reading or Stoneham, then a special commissioner shall act in his stead, as provided in section twelve of chapter seventeen of the General Statutes.

When special commissioner shall act.

SECTION 5. The mayor and aldermen of the city of Charlestown shall take the care and superintendence of said bridge, and shall employ all services necessary in the care thereof; and said city shall be liable for any loss or injury that any person may sustain by reason of any carelessness, neglect or misconduct of its agents and servants in such management and superintendence.

Mayor and aldermen of Charlestown to have care of bridge. City liable for loss through neglect, &c.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE SAINT JOSEPH'S LYCEUM IN CAMBRIDGE.

Chap. 267

Be it enacted, &c., as follows:

SECTION 1. James Cox, J. H. Jessop, James I. Duffy, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation under the name and title of the St. Joseph's Lyceum, in the city of Cambridge, for literary and educational purposes; with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities set forth in all general laws which now are or hereafter may be in force in relation to such corporations.

SECTION 2. Said corporation, for the purposes aforesaid, may hold real estate to the amount of seventy-five thousand dollars.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
