

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that Nathaniel Wells, Esqr; be, and he hereby is empowered, to issue his warrant to some principal inhabitant of said town, requiring him to warn the inhabitants of said Town, qualified according to law, to vote in Town affairs, to assemble at such time and place within the same Town, as shall be appointed by such warrant, to choose all such Officers as other Towns within this Commonwealth are empowered to choose, in the month of March or April annually; and the said inhabitants so assembled are hereby empowered to choose such Officers according.

AN ACT PROVIDING AN ESTABLISHMENT FOR THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL. *Chap. 84*

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That the allowance to be made to the Attorney General, for his services the year next ensuing, commencing from the passing of this Act, be the sum of three hundred pounds, and the same shall be paid him out of the public Treasury.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That in taxing bills of costs in criminal prosecutions, the sum of fifteen shillings, shall be taxed in each bill of costs, instead of the fee established by Law, for the travel of the Attorney General, and all the fees received by the said Attorney General, in and by virtue of his said Office, shall be accounted for by him.
