

## CHAP. LXXXV.

An Act to establish The Stow Cotton Manufactory.

SEC. 1. **BE** it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That Silas Jewell, Abraham Randall, jun. William Trobridge, and Winslow Dunton, together with such other persons as may hereafter associate with them, their successors and assigns, be, and they hereby are made a corporation, by the name of The Stow Cotton Manufactory, for the purpose of manufacturing cotton yarn and cloth in the town of Stow, in the county of Middlesex; and for that purpose shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements contained in an act, entitled "An act defining the general powers and duties of Manufacturing Corporations," passed on the third day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine.

Persons incorporated.

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the said Corporation may be lawfully seized and possessed of such real estate, not exceeding the value of thirty thousand dollars, and such personal estate, not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, as may be necessary and convenient for carrying on the manufacture of cotton yarn and cloth in said town of Stow.

May hold real and personal estate.
