

a time not less than one month, at one time, first giving public notice of such times in each year, within which they give such permission, by advertising the same two weeks successively in one public newspaper printed in the County of Essex, and two public newspapers printed in the County of Suffolk.

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the harbors of said Gloucester shall be considered and taken by this act to be and to extend as follows, to wit: The harbor of Gloucester from Norman's Woe, on the west side, to Eastern Point, on the south side. The harbor of Sandy Bay, from Gap-head on the east side, to Pigeon Cove on the north side. The harbor of Annis Squam, from Hallibut Point on the east side, to Two Penny Loaf on the west side.

SEC. 3. *Be it further enacted*, That all fines and forfeitures which may be incurred for offences against this act, shall accrue one half to him or them who may first sue for the same, and the other half to the use of the Commonwealth. And the said fines and forfeitures may be recovered with legal costs of suit by action of debt, or information before any Justice of Peace for the County of Essex; and any person or persons aggrieved by the sentence of the Justice of Peace, given in pursuance of this act, may appeal thereupon to the next Court of Common Pleas to be held in the County, in which judgment may be rendered.

### CHAP. CXXXIII.

An act to apportion and assess a tax of seventy-five thousand dollars, and to provide for the reimbursement of sixteen thousand nine hundred and ninety-nine dollars, paid out of the public treasury, to the members of the House of Representatives, for their attendance the two last sessions of the General Court.
