

Sums appropriated.

SEC. 4. *Be it further enacted*, That for the procuring of suitable cases to contain and preserve said books, there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of two hundred dollars, and that the further sum of three hundred dollars annually, for ten years, be, and hereby is, appropriated, to procure such books, maps, and charts, works of science and the arts, as may, in the judgment of said Committee tend to illustrate the resources and means of internal improvement of this Commonwealth, or of the United States, and that His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of Council, be, and he hereby is authorized and empowered, from time to time, to draw his warrant on the Treasury for the sums aforesaid.

CHAP. CXXIV.

An Act to change the name of the Boston and Braintree Copper and Brass Manufactory.

BE *it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same*, That the Corporation now known by the name of the Boston and Braintree Copper and Brass Manufactory shall be allowed hereafter to take the name of the Boston Copper Company.
