

CHAP. XIV.

An Act to incorporate the Centralville Cotton and
Woollen Manufacturing Company.

SEC. 1. **BE** *it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same,* That David Lester and Amos Avery, Jr. their associates, successors and assigns, be, and they are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Centralville Cotton and Woollen Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing cotton and woollen goods in the town of Stockbridge, in the county of Berkshire, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and requirements contained in an act passed on the twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty, entitled "an act defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations."

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the said corporation may take and hold such real estate, not exceeding in value the sum of sixty thousand dollars, and such personal estate, not exceeding in value the sum of ninety thousand dollars, as may be suitable and convenient for carrying on the manufactures aforesaid.
