

Chap. 465 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMISSIONER OF MENTAL HEALTH TO TRANSFER TO THE CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS CERTAIN PROPERTY OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN THE CITY OF WORCESTER.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Subject to the approval of the governor and council, the commissioner of mental health, in the name and on behalf of the commonwealth, is hereby authorized to transfer to the control of the state department of public works, for its use, a portion of the land situated on the northerly side of Belmont street and the westerly side of Lake avenue north in the city of Worcester, with a frontage not exceeding three hundred and fifty feet on Belmont street and three hundred and ten feet on Lake avenue north; said transfer to be subject to such conditions and restrictions for the benefit of the Worcester state hospital as may seem advisable to said commissioner.

Chap. 466 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CONVEY A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN THE TOWN OF SHEFFIELD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The department of public works, in the name and on behalf of the commonwealth, and subject to the approval of the governor and council, may convey to William H. Gilligan for the sum of seventeen hundred dollars a parcel of land containing about six acres located on the northerly side of Bow Wow road in the town of Sheffield, which parcel was purchased in the year nineteen hundred and forty-nine for garage purposes and does not meet present departmental requirements.

Chap. 467 AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EXPENDITURES OF FUNDS FOR THE WELFARE OF CERTAIN PRISONERS UPON THEIR RELEASE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

G. L. (Ter. Ed.), 127, § 162, amended.

Payment to prisoners upon release, authorized.

Chapter 127 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 162, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following:—
Section 162. The warden of the state prison and the superintendent of the Massachusetts reformatory, the reformatory for women, the state prison colony and the state farm may expend such sums, not in excess of twenty dollars for any prisoner, as may be appropriated for the welfare of prisoners who are released therefrom.
