

*Section 10.* Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to affect adversely the rights of any person who is a member of any contributory retirement system established under the provisions of sections one to twenty-eight, inclusive, of chapter thirty-two or under corresponding provisions of earlier laws, with reference to accumulated total deductions or benefits accrued or to be accrued on account of any service rendered by him.

Rights of members of certain contributory retirement systems, not to be affected.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF LAURENCE H. BANKS AS A CITY COUNCILLOR OF THE CITY OF BOSTON. *Chap. 659*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Laurence H. Banks shall receive from the city of Boston as compensation for his services during such part of the current municipal year of said city as he shall sit as a city councillor of said city a sum of money equal to the salary to which he would have been entitled had he served as a city councillor of said city continuously from the first Monday of January in the year nineteen hundred and fifty to the first Monday of January in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-two.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CONVEYANCE OF A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND TO THE CITY OF WESTFIELD BY THE MILITARY DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH. *Chap. 660*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The military department of the commonwealth, on behalf and in the name of the commonwealth and subject to the approval of the governor and council, shall convey to the city of Westfield, for a consideration of one dollar, a certain parcel of land in said city within the premises of the Westfield State Armory, for the purpose of enabling said city to improve and expand its elementary educational facilities, the said parcel being particularly described and bounded as follows:—Beginning at an iron pin on the southerly line of the town dike location, said dike being the land of the city of Westfield, said iron pin being also at the northwesterly corner of the land now or formerly of the L. D. Phillips Construction Company; running thence at twelve degrees ten minutes southwest for a distance of one hundred and fifty-seven and sixty-four one hundredths feet to an iron pin; thence at seventy-seven degrees, fifty-six minutes and forty seconds northwest for a distance of ninety-one and fifty-four one hundredths feet to an iron pin at the land of the commonwealth: the last two described courses being along the land of the said L. D. Phillips Construction Company; thence along the land of the commonwealth at
